#### **I PREAMBLE**

This is a five year integrated M.A course, which can be pursued either as B.A. (Natya) UG course (Three years) or an integrated M.A. (Natya) PG course (Five years). It develops the capacity of a dancer not only on the perspective of dance but also the problem solving and project handling capacity.

#### II ELIGIBILITY

Candidates who have undergone the course of study prior to the academic year 2008-2009 will be permitted to appear for the examinations under those regulations for a period of three years i.e. upto inclusive of April/May 2012 examinations. Thereafter, they will be permitted to appear for the examinations only under the regulations then in force.

#### III PROGRAMMEOBJECTIVES

- **1.**M.A. Natya degree is structured to provide a strong foundation in Natyasastra and to offer a holistic knowledge on the theory and practice of 108 Karanas.
- **2.**To gain in-depth knowledge on core subjects like Carnatic music, Bharatanatyam, Drama and allied subjects like Yoga, Philosophy, History, Temple architecture, etc.
- **3.**To inculcate the tradition of Guru parampara to the students along with the importance of professional approach towards the art form.
- **4.**To emphasize and mold the students into holistic artistes & to perform, teach and conduct nattuvangam with confidence.





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	PO1: Students are well equipped with the holistic knowledge of the concepts of Natya namely music, dance and theatre and develop them with presentation skills, research skills and also teaching skills. The students are imparted knowledge by encapsulating the historic, theoretical and practical aspects.
	PO2: Students will be trained from the basics of natya, bharatanatyamadavus, music, theory, theatre and yoga, as they start with the Bachelor's degree program and continue with other advanced aspects of practicals such as karanas, theory, nattuvangam and choreography in the MA programme.
	PO3: Students are encouraged to pursue research in the field of natya, or become successful performers, competitive teachers and professors of natya along with the knowledge of dance history, dance music, nattuvangam, yoga, theatre skills which are gained through this course.
	PO4: The meticulously drafted syllabus of the MA Natya five year integrated programme lays a strong foundation and also provides expertise in the field of natya for the students to preserve the history, give shape to the present and develop the future. The course makes the students understand and preserve the value of art and culture of India through this art.
	PO5: Individual students are groomed according to their interest and field during the course. Music and nattuvangam course is linked to the main program to help the student gain musical knowledge as music is an integral part of dance.
	PO6: Students also obtain substantial knowledge about the history of Indian dance and drama during the study of the comprehensive theory papers, Textual Sources of Koothu- Tamil tradition, Natya- Sanskrit tradition, Indian Art and Cultural history, Indian philosophy, World theatre, etc. The student develops the skills of a good and competitive performer or a teacher at the end of the course.

	PO9: Students are trained in performance style with a very strong theoretic background and are capable to showcase the same at the end of the course.
	PO10 Knowledge and skills: Ability to exhibit various important theoretical aspects in Natya Texts (Lakshana grantha-s), Performing dance, singing and doing nattuvangam for a dance programme, knowledge of history and evolution of dance and drama and its several elements are developed during this course. Knowledge of music pertaining to dance such as regional music, devotional music and compositions of various composers is imparted to the students. Techniques of Yogasana and theatre skills such as acting, voice training, etc. are developed for their performance.
	Importance to bharatanatyam as well as other various Indian dance forms is given in the course. Important texts in literature that have references to ancient Tamil dance forms, abhinayas, sculptures depicting dance, and other aspects associated with dance are taught to the students. The allied theory subjects like art history, cultural history, philosophy, etc. Will also lead the students to take up any other carrier which will support them as dancers. The programme curriculum is a preparation for the students as a performer, a teacher and a researcher as per their interests.
