THE COLLEGE MANAGEMENT

Dr. MGR-Janaki College was the result of the visionary zeal of Smt. Janaki Ramachandran who desired to convert the grounds of Sathya Studio into a College for Women. The college also supports Dr. MGR Higher Secondary School and Home for the Speech and Hearing Impaired at Ramavaram, a noble cause envisioned by the founders. The campus in its sylvan setting is centrally located and well connected by buses from all parts of the city. All facilities like banks, post offices, hospitals and shops are within walking distance from the college. The college is managed by SSPL Charities, the charitable unit of Sathya Studios Private Limited, headed by the Chairman and Managing Trustee Dr. Kumar Rajendran.

Founded in 1996 with just 70 students and 16 faculty members the college is affiliated to the University of Madras. It has grown to the status of a front ranking institution with nearly 4000 students and over 150 faculty members today. At present the college has 15 Under Graduate and 7 Post Graduate Departments.

Our mentors, Dr. M. G. Ramachandran and Smt. Janaki Ramachandran believed that we should create an atmosphere where excellence is the result of diligence on the part of the students. Our college motto is "Excellence through Diligence".

ANOTE TO STUDENTS

Each one of you is endowed with certain talent. We provide you with an ideal environment for your talent to blossom through academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

You, as a representative of the college should uphold the high standards and ideals of the institution in your behavior in the college and outside the campus. You are expected to conform to the rules of the college for the collective welfare of the college.

- College timings: Shift I 08.15 a.m. to 01.10 p.m.; Shift II 01.10 p.m. 05.40 p.m. Students of Shift I coming after 08.45 a.m. will lose attendance for the 1st hour. Students of Shift II coming after 01.30 p.m. will lose attendance for the 1st hour.
- Cell phones are banned inside the college premises. If found, the phones will be confiscated.
- Students are expected to dress modestly and avoid expensive jewelry. Students are advised not be bring cash or valuables to the college. If they do, the college will not be responsible for the loss of the same.
- 4. Parents need to report to the class teacher the very next day if their daughter has been absent. For absence beyond two days, parents must meet the class teacher at college. Students will be withheld from appearing for their examinations if they lack attendance.

- 5. Students should enroll for NSS / Rotaract / Red Ribbon Club/Youth Red Cross and put in compulsory attendance of 80 hours within the two semesters in any one of the above mentioned extension activities.
- Internal assessment will be calculated for 25 marks which will include attendance, internal test, assignments and seminars.
- 7. The fee for the university examination payable to the University of Madras will have to be paid before the exams failing which, the student cannot write the exams.
- Withdrawal from any course in the middle of the academic year will not be encouraged.
- Parent-teacher meeting will be held every semester after 1st unit test. Parents are requested to sign the consent letter and attend the meetings.
- Parents can meet the Principal with prior appointment on all working days.
- 11. You are expected to get the Principal's permission for publishing any matter about the college in newspapers, magazines or journals. Any interview given to a television channel regarding the college requires prior permission from the Principal. Organizing any meeting or collection of money for any purpose in the campus requires prior permission from the Principal.

- 12. Ragging is totally banned under the orders of the central and state government and the University of Madras. There should be no ragging of any sort inside the campus or outside. Students of the college who violate this directive will be severely dealt with. A complaint box in black color has been placed in front of the Principal's office. Any complaints of ragging should be reported to the Principal or the Anti Ragging Cell. The matter will be kept strictly confidential.
- 13. The Principal is empowered to fine, withhold attendance certificate, suspend and expel students, if considered necessary to maintain the calm atmosphere and to ensure a peaceful learning environment according to the rules framed by the state and central government and also according to various judgments of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- 14. The college property is for your use. It is your duty to protect and maintain it. Those found disfiguring furniture, walls, destroying plants and littering the campus will be fined / penalized.
- 15. You are requested to conserve water and electricity by turning off taps after use and switching off fans and lights before leaving the class room.
- 16. Students are advised to check the notice boards regularly. Ignorance of the information given in the notice board will not be taken as an excuse for non-compliance.

- 17. When you move from one class to another, do not disturb the other classes, and if you have free time, spend it in the library or in any other useful activity.
- 18. Those who come by two wheelers must have a valid license, wear a proper helmet and park the vehicles in an orderly manner.
- 19. Along with academic excellence, the college expects students to be courteous, helpful and cooperative towards their staff members and fellow students.
- 20. We expect the parents and the students to cooperate in all matters for the smooth functioning of the institution.

COLLEGE FEES

- Fees for the year should be paid within the stipulated time.
 Fees for the academic year 2022 2023 should be paid between February 10th 2022 and March 15th 2022.
- 2. Students who do not pay the fees within the due date will pay a fine of Rs. 5/- per day up to the next 10 working days after which their names will be struck off the register.
- 3. In the event of the student leaving the college in the middle of the academic year she will have to pay the fee for the full academic year.

- 4. Students with arrears of fees or any dues to the college will not be permitted to appear for the university examinations even though examination fees might have been paid by the students. Their hall tickets will be withheld for such non-payment.
- Students must have the fee receipts carefully and must produce them whenever required.
- Transfer certificates will be given only to those who have paid fees, returned library books and settled all other dues.
- 7. In case of breakage of equipment, apparatus, or other articles or property of the college, charges will be collected from the students. The decision of the Principal will be final in this matter.

STUDENT TRAINING PROGRAMMES

1. Physical Education

All students are encouraged to take part in games and sports. Talented students are encouraged to join the college team. Self-defense classes will be conducted.

2. Compulsory Extension Services

The University of Madras stipulates that all students must enroll themselves in one of these compulsory extension programmes.

i) National Service Scheme

The college encourages the students to actively take part in the NSS activities so as to serve the society. An annual camp is held in the NSS adopted village every year. The NSS students are encouraged to join the camp and participate in community service.

ii) Rotaract Club

The Rotaract club focuses on engaging the students in awareness rallies, fund raising programmes for social causes, helping the differently- abled and so on. These activities aim at promoting social responsibilities and leadership qualities in students.

iii) Red Ribbon Club

The Red Ribbon Club spreads awareness about health issues particularly AIDS prevention by involving students in activities like rallies, street plays and counseling sessions.

iv) Youth Red Cross

The Youth Red Cross involves students in organizing camps, blood donation camp, first aid courses etc. to promote the spirit of service without discrimination.

ATTENDANCE

All the students are requested to attend classes every day without fail. Attendance is taken at every lecture, practical or tutorial hour of any kind prescribed in the college timetable, including b. games, social ethics, certificate courses, eye opener sessions and compulsory extension service activities.

Permission for absence will be subject to valid explanation

- a. Absence due to illness should be supported by a medical report from a registered medical practitioner.
- b. Students absenting themselves to participate in extracurricular activities representing the college should submit permission letters to the Principal through the authorized staff members.
- c. Any student coming in after the morning prayer will be marked absent for one hour. If a student is absent for one hour, she will lose half a day's attendance.
- d. A student will be permitted to take the university examination only if she has a minimum of 75% attendance per course. The decision of the Principal shall be final in all matters concerning attendance.

TESTING AND EVALUATION

Evaluation of the student is based on both Continuous Assessment and End Semester Examination.

- a. There will be continuous internal assessment for 25 marks per paper per semester along with the end semester examination for 75 marks.
- b. No student should absent herself from any examination or test. Disciplinary action will be taken against absentees of examination and test.
- c. The conduct of the student during the test and examination should be beyond reproach. Any student indulging in unfair practices will be dealt with seriously.
- d. Assessment will be in the form of a comprehensive examination for each paper at the end of each term. The examination will be conducted by the university for which the students should register for the examination by paying the prescribed fees.

STUDENT SENATE

The objectives of the senate are:

- To uphold and implement the ideals of the college by organizing programmes which have the sanction of the Principal.
- To foster goodwill and cordial relations between the students and the faculty.
- To promote healthy participation in extra -curricular and co -curricular activities .

LIBRARY

- The Library is open between 09.00 a.m. and 04.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday and between 09.00 a.m. and 02.00 p.m. on Saturday.
- Only members are allowed to use the services of the library on producing their identification cards.
- Outsiders have to get prior permission from the Management/Principal to utilize the library.
- The Library is fully automated with INFLIBNET and DELNET. Members are provided with a bar-coded identity card and a library card by the college.
- The exchange of library card is not permissible. Books will be provided only against a valid library card. UG students can borrow two books and PG students can borrow three books. Only one renewal is permitted.
- Duration of the lending period is fifteen days, fine amount 6. of Rs. 1/- per day is charged for the delayed return of books. Rs. 20/- will be charged against the loss of each library card. Audio, Video Cassettes and CD's are meant for use only within the library.
- The facility to reserve book is available. Book will be issued according to the order in which they are reserved. Reserved book will not be renewed.

- 8. Pilferage of document will be treated as a serious offence.

 The membership may be suspended or cancelled.
- 9. In case a book is lost, the member should either replace the book or pay double the cost of the book to the library.
- 10. Photocopying of library documents is permitted.

 Photocopying the entire document / book is prohibited.

 Photocopying will be charged at the rate of Rs. 1/- per page.
- 11. Document other than library sources shall not be permitted inside the library.
- 12. The use of tape recorder, radio, mobile phone and camera is strictly prohibited inside the library.
- 13. Members are requested to leave their personal belongings in the property counter.
- 14. Final year students can avail the institutional membership available with British Council and University of Madras.
- 15. Book bank facility can be availed by deserving students.

LABORATORIES

Expensive equipments have been installed in the laboratories for the benefit of the students. Great care must be taken in handling equipment. Work tables and sanitary fittings should be kept absolutely clean at all times. All breakages and losses must be reported to the faculty concerned immediately. Breakage will be collected.

COMPUTER LABORATORY

We have a well-equipped air-conditioned computer laboratory which has Pentium servers and nodes. Latest software with internet connection is available.

COUNSELLING

In addition to the advisor advisee session, there is a professional counsellor available on campus at a specified time on specified days of the week.

Canteen

There is a canteen within the campus, which serves healthy and tasty food, in a hygienic manner, at reasonable rates.

Identity Cards

Each student of the college is expected to possess an identity card with her photograph affixed on it duly attested by the Principal. They are advised to keep the card with them always and use them for getting concessional tickets to travel by bus, rail or air, to become a member of public libraries or for the receipt of payment of scholarship, etc. Identity cards for the first year students will be issued in the college. Students will have to wear the ID card inside the college premises.

Issue of Certificates

For the issue of any certificate, an application has to be made giving details about the student. A prior notice of two days is necessary for the issue of a certificate. On completion of their entire course (Under - Graduate or Post - Graduate) students are expected to collect their original certificates including the Transfer Certificate from the office. A student will be furnished with a T.C. on application, if she applies within 5 working days of the term succeeding her leaving the college. Applications made after that will attract a search fee.
